
Please email me copies of any work that you have completed, as I would love to see what you have done and how you are getting on. If you have done anything extra, I would love to see that too.

You could write about their childhood, their family and the journey to get to the Olympics. Where did they train? What events do they do? What are their personal bests?




### Maths Challenge

This week we will continue our learning on angles.



There are 180 degrees on a straight line.
